#### **GREEN INTIATIVES**




The property anchors the Peter B. Lewis Gateway Center, the cornerstone of Oberlin's Green Arts District, an ongoing development conceived by the City and College to transform Oberlin into a model for environmentally aware economic development based on education and the arts.

The Hotel at Oberlin is the first hotel in the nation to incorporate solar, geothermal and radiant heating and cooling. Using locally sourced materials and provocative design, The Hotel at Oberlin is a celebration of the community's rich history and progressive vision toward the future.



## MEETING AND EVENT SPACE





With 6,500 square feet of meeting and event space, The Hotel at Oberlin offers a flexible floor plan to accommodate groups from 10-300 people.

Our Peter. B. Lewis Event Center features 3,800 square feet of state-ofthe-art space with large windows and high ceilings creating the ideal venue for both meetings and social engagements. The room is divisible into five separate sections for break-out space or intimate gatherings.

The Event Center is supported by 1,300 square feet of pre-function and terrace space overlooking Tappan Square. Our Lucy Stone room features 850 square feet of meeting space and is ideal for executive retreats and small business meetings.
